What is Cub Scout camp?

Cub Scout Camp is a great summer activity for Cub Scouts. It is an outdoor experience where Cub Scouts can shoot BB guns, bows and arrows, learn about nature, do leatherwork and crafts, play games, sing songs, and do lots more activities. Leaders and boys alike have a great time.

Who can attend Cub Scout Camp?

All registered Cub Scouts going into the 1st grade but not yet finished with the 5th grade are eligible to attend. Boys starting the 1st grade in the fall are also eligible.

When and where is Cub Scout Camp?

Eight Camps will be conducted this summer throughout the Council. See below for exact dates and locations. Scouts and units can attend **any** camp that they choose. You can also attend **MORE** than **ONE** camp. Leaders attend Camp at no cost. If they would like to purchase a Camp T-shirt, they may do so on the Registration form.

Registrations made after the early bird deadline (see individual Camp Information flyer for exact deadline date) will NOT receive a FREE Camp T-Shirt.

Camp T-shirts:

One camp T-shirt will be provide **FREE** to all Scouts and Staff members but only on a pre-order basis and on or before the Early Bird Deadline. Additional t-shirts can be purchased at a cost of \$12.00 each. See the registration form for ordering information.

What about leadership?

Each pack must provide one leader for every five boys and a minimum of two leaders per pack. Parents are encouraged to participate. Staff does not count in this total. Parents/Leaders complete a separate application for medical purposes.

What to bring?

Some camps will require that Cub Scouts bring a non-perishable sack lunch each day. You will be advised of this need prior to the beginning of camp. Bring rain gear if weather looks threatening. Leaders may bring a chair and a small tarp for the boys to sit on as well as insect repellent and sun block. Your camp director will contact you prior to camp to give you more specific details such as arrival time etc.

Trading Post

A Trading Post will be open at camp. People will be able to purchase T-shirts (subject to availability), candy and some Scout supplies. Scouts may want to bring \$10-\$15 for great trading post items.

Insurance

A special accident insurance policy will be provided. This is secondary insurance and will become effective after a family policy is exhausted.

What about younger children?

Some of our Camps offer a special area called the Me Too's Camp. It is set up for younger children of adults who are serving as den leaders and staff members and are at camp on the days needed. These children can stay at the camp for a nominal fee of \$10.00 for the entire week or for any combination of days. Snacks and activities will be provided. T-shirts will **NOT** be provided but you may purchase one on the registration form. **Children must be potty trained.** These children should bring a sack lunch also. Parents must be present at the camp while Me Too's are present. Please contact the Council Office to determine if the Camp in your area provides this service.

Need financial assistance?

Camperships are available for those who may need help with the camp fees. This assistance will provide up to half of the camp fees for those that qualify.
