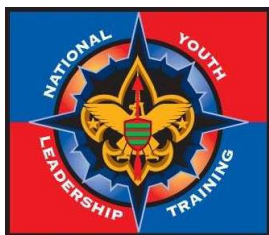

National Youth Leadership Training

Participant Fact Sheet

What is National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT)? NYLT is an exciting, action-packed program designed to provide Boy Scouts with leadership skills and experience they can use in their home troops and in other situations demanding leadership of self and others. NYLT is the second phase of the Youth Training Continuum, and builds on Troop Leadership Training. THIS IS NOT A SKILLS CAMP!

What is the Youth Training Continuum? Boy Scout youth leadership training is a three-phase training experience. The first phase, Troop Leadership Training, begins in the troop with the senior patrol leader and the Scoutmaster conducting the training, and prepares the Scouts to run their patrols and troop. Phase two is NYLT conducted by the local council, and the third phase is advanced training at Philmont Scout Ranch, such as National Youth Leader Instructor Camp and National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience.

Who is eligible? NYLT is designed for registered Boy Scouts. The following requirements must be met by the date orientation: 1) reached 13 years of age, 2) completed the seventh grade, 3) earned the rank of First Class, and 4) completed a troop-level leadership training (phase 1 in youth training continuum).

Why should Scouts attend NYLT? Leadership experiences can be frustrating and disappointing for a Scout that lacks the knowledge, skills and encouragement to fulfill his assignment. During NYLT, participants discover that leading themselves and others requires a vision--a picture of future success. Through presentations and positive experiences in goal setting, planning, and problem solving, participants learn how to set a clear course toward realizing their team and individual visions, and then how to put themselves in the center of those pictures of future success. As a result, Scouts are trained to better serve their troops when placed in leadership positions. NYLT also fulfills the training prerequisite for the advanced training courses at Philmont Scout Ranch.

Costs? \$100. A deposit of \$50 must accompany the participant's application and be submitted by Sunday, May 16th. Refunds will not be available after that date, but fees are transferable to another participant. The remainder (\$50) is due by Sunday, June 6. The troop may choose to pay part of the fee. Partial Camp Scholarships are also available through the Council Service Center. The application is available at www.goldenspread.org/Forms/campership.pdf.

Where? The week-long course is held entirely at Camp Don Harrington near Amarillo, TX.

When? Prior to the course, participants must attend a one-hour course orientation, accompanied by a troop adult leader, at either of the following locations:

Sunday, May 16 at 2:00 pm at Camp Don Harrington, or
Thursday, May 27 at 7:00 pm at First United Methodist in Pampa, TX

The course begins at 1:00 pm on Sunday, June 6th and concludes at 4:30 pm on Friday, June 11th after the closing ceremony. Scouts are expected to attend the entire session to receive full credit. Trips out of camp must be limited and made only with the Course Director's approval.

Course overview? NYLT is a six-day course that integrates the best of modern leadership theory with the traditional strengths of the Scouting experience. This course centers around concepts of what a leader must **BE**, what he must **KNOW**, and what he must **DO**. The key elements are then taught with clear focus on **HOW TO**. The skills come alive during the week as the patrol goes on a *Quest for the Meaning of Leadership*.

Content is delivered in a troop and patrol outdoor setting with an emphasis on immediate application of learning in a fun environment. Concepts and work processes are introduced and then built upon, through the use of memory aids that result in a participant understanding and employing the leadership skills much faster.

Here's a brief outline of what Scouts can expect to accomplish during this training:

Day One: Communicating Well, Part I; Finding Your Vision, Part I.

Day Two: Setting Your Goals; Preparing Your Plans.

Day Three: Forming Your Team; Problem Solving; Leading EDGE (Explain, Demonstrate, Guide, Enable).

Day Four: Teaching EDGE; Resolving Conflicts; Making Ethical Decisions.

Day Five: Leading Yourself; Valuing People.

Day Six: Finding Your Vision, Part II; Communicating Well, Part II; Creating A Future.

Personal equipment required? The participant is required to bring all the personal equipment necessary for a long term camp, such as 1-2 person tent, bedding, eating and bathing supplies. Also, each participant should be prepared to carry their own gear, preferably stored within or attached to a backpack and/or duffle bag.

How do I apply? Please submit the following items to the Council office or NYLT Scoutmaster by Sunday, May 16th, 2010:

- Completed application, including Parental and Scoutmaster approvals
- Complete Health and Medical Record (Parts A, B, & C)
- Deposit of \$50
