Shooting Sports:

In addition to the BSA's Guide to Safe Scouting and Shooting Sports Guidelines for Cub Scouts, the following rules are related to the use of Council Shooting Sports Ranges and Equipment:

- Review the Guide to Safe Scouting- Guns and Firearms sections.
- The council will furnish firearms. Ammunition will not be furnished.
- The council will furnish bows, arrows and targets.
- 4. Council owned Clay Throwers may be used- see Equipment requested section.
- Only approved firearms can be used on the camp range. Personal firearms brought to camp for the sole purpose of target shooting and Merit Badge Instruction MUST be approved by both the NRA Instructor AND the RSO (Range Safety Officer) before use.
- 6. Guns and ammunition must be transported separately by an adult over age 21 and locked up when not in use.
- All shotgun/rifle/handgun shooting activities MUST be supervised by a current NRA-certified Shotgun Instructor/Rifle Instructor/Pistol Instructor and when on the range, must be supervised by a currently NRA certified RSO. These are two different people!

- 8. All safety briefings/training will be completed prior to shooting.
- 9. Archery and BB gun shooting (Cub Scouts) are restricted to Day Camps, Cub Scout Scout Resident camps, and council-managed family camping programs or at council/district coordinated activities. Archery and BB gun shooting are not to be done at the Pack level or by individuals.

Swimming Pool/Lake:

In addition to the BSA's "Safe Swim Defense" policies and procedures, the following rules and procedures must be followed when using council swimming facilities:

- 1. Reservations will be made for 4 hour periods.
- 2. Qualified Supervisor supervising the swim (21 years of age or older) on site making sure Safe Swim Defense procedures are followed (should be certified in Safe Swim Defense so they know what it is all about and how it works).
- 3. Rescue Personnel watching all swimmers from the side of the pool. They can be lifeguards or just strong swimmer youth (must have a minimum of two and maintain 1 rescuer to 10 swimmers ratio).
- 4. Lookouts (could be one or more) stationed around the area watching swimmers swim. If they see any problems they alert the rescue personnel so a proper response can be made. Lookouts would not go in the water at all. They are the eyes/ears to alert rescue personnel that a response is needed.

Boats/Canoes/Sailboats:

In addition to the BSA's "Safety Afloat" policies and procedures, the following rules and procedures must be followed when using council aquatic equipment:

- 1. <u>All adult leaders of the group must complete Safety Afloat Training and have the Training Card with them and agree to fully comply with the nine points of Safety Afloat.</u>
- 2. A responsible adult (21 or older) who is trained and certified in Safe Swim Defense and Safety Afloat training and who has the Training Card on hand must be the overall supervisor of the activity. In addition to that person, at least one other supervisor (18 or older) must provide additional supervisor duties and must be present at all times. The ratio for supervisors is (Boy Scouts/Venture groups) is 1 for every 10 people with a minimum of two adults for any one group. The ratio for supervisors is (Cub Scout groups) 1 for every 5 people. This supervisor(s) must be trained and certified in Safe Swim Defense and Safety Afloat training, have rescue training for the type of watercraft being used, and trained in CPR. It is strongly recommended that there is at least one adult or older youth member who is currently trained as a BSA Lifeguard to assist with the planning and conducting of all activities afloat.
- 3. Only boats and canoes owned by the Council will be permitted on camp waters unless prior approval is obtained.
- 4. If, in the opinion of the Camp Ranger/Campmaster, the water level has reached an unsafe or damaging level or weather conditions are worsening, boats/canoes will not be issued.
- 5. If damages are incurred on equipment, the Ranger will note it and the Council will bill the group for replacement or repairs. All equipment must be secured (including Boats, Canoes, PFD, Paddles etc.) prior to departing the area.
