Basic Camp Rules

VEHICLES

- 1. <u>MAXIMUM</u> CAMP SPEED LIMIT IS <u>15 MPH</u> !!!!!!!(Everywhere)
- 2. Vehicles used to transport equipment to a campsite must be returned to the parking lot when equipment has been unloaded. Vehicles are to remain in the parking lot expect to load and unload equipment.
- 3. Do not drive vehicles into the campsites or park trailers in the campsites. Park on the road and carry equipment onto the site. Troop trailers may be left at the campsite in appropriate parking areas.
- 4. No person may ride in the back of an open truck or trailer on property owned by Boy Scouts Of America.

<u>FIRES</u>

- 1. Fires are permitted in steel fire rings only. DO NOT MOVE THE RINGS.
- 2. An adult must be present any time a fire is burning.
- 3. No fire may be left unattended. If you leave your campsite or when going to bed at night, be sure the fire is completely out.
- 4. Keep fire barrel full of water and fire buckets readily available. These items are available from the Quartermaster, Ranger or Camp master.
- 5. Keep fires to a moderate size. (Flames 24" or less)

<u>TRASH</u>

- 1. Do not put trash in trash cans that do not have liners. Liners are available from the Quartermaster.
- 2. Remove all trash from the campsite when you leave camp. Trash may be put in the trash trailer located at the dining hall as long as it is in trash bags and the bags are tied shut. Please, no loose trash in the trailer.

<u>General</u>

- 1. No Pets (even on a leash)
- 2. No Alcohol, firearms, or fireworks
- 3. Curfew is 11:00 pm. Everyone should be in their campsite and refrain from excessive noise at that time.
- 4. Buildings may be used only by reservation
- 5. Fishing is permitted except within 100' of the boat docks
- 6. Raccoons are numerous. Protect trash and food at night
- 7. Do not harass wildlife- RESPECT IT. Remember, critters do bite
