<b>Sunday</b>	Draw your name on <b>paper</b> in fancy letters and decorate with your favorite colors.	Make a crossword on <b>graph paper</b> using the names of your family members - make a fancy border.	Use the squares on <b>graph paper</b> to create a cool mosaic in vibrant colors.
<b>Monday</b>	Make a <b>paper bag</b> puppet! Color in the face and add hair.	Put a variety of items in a <b>paper bag</b> - have a family member feel them without looking and see if they can guess your items.	Make a kite from a <b>paper bag</b> as a decoration for your wall - add a ribbon tail.
<b>Tuesday</b>	Play rock, <b>paper</b> , scissors with a sibling or friend!	Have a contest to see who can make the longest <b>paperclip</b> chain in the shortest amount of time!	How many <b>paperclips</b> can you attach to a sheet of paper in 60 seconds? Try to beat your record!
<b>Wednesday</b>	Tear colored <b>construction paper</b> into small pieces (no scissors allowed!). Then glue into a picture or pattern.	Make a <b>construction paper</b> sculpture by bending and gluing together different sizes and colors of paper.	Using <b>construction paper</b> and stickers, make several greeting cards for different occasions. Send one!
<b>Thursday</b>	Unroll <b>toilet paper</b> on the floor to create a "track" for your vehicles to travel on!	Make an obstacle course by unrolling <b>toilet paper</b> all over a room - can you get from one end to the other without touching it?	Wrap your favorite tall person in <b>toilet paper</b> !
<b>Friday</b>	Find a favorite illustration in a book and use <b>tracing paper</b> to copy and color.	Draw a stained glass pattern onto <b>tracing paper</b> - outline in black and color it in. Hang it in your window!	Put <b>tracing paper</b> over your favorite comic strip. Draw the strips, but add your own dialogue!
<b>Saturday</b>	Find some beautiful flowers to press between <b>parchment paper</b> . Add a stack of books on top to flatten.	Crumple <b>paper</b> , then smooth it out and spritz with tea or coffee. Let it dry and you have antique paper for a project!	Help a grown-up do some baking using <b>parchment paper</b> to line your baking sheets. Yum!
