

Cleaning and Disinfection Guidelines for Camps

COVID-19 Pandemic

Effective June 1, 2020

The following guideline are from various sources including the Centers for Disease Control, and the Field Guide for Camps on Implementation of CDC Guidance. Anytime an adult is disinfecting or sanitizing, he/she should wear a mask and gloves and protective apron. These should all be disposed of immediately after use. The only people who authorized to clean and disinfect are adults. NO Scouts or Youth Staff members should be allowed or asked to do this task.

The frequency of cleaning and disinfecting depends on the use and frequency. After **each use** is the preferred frequency but **multiple times** per day is acceptable. The supplies to be used are as follows:

- Disinfecting spray (bottles). They should be Ready to Use (RTU) in plastic bottles. You may use the disinfectant that is available in a concentrate and mixed properly by the instructions on the bottle.
- Bleach- This should be mixed 5 tablespoons to one gallon of water or 4 teaspoons to one quart of water. Spray bottles should be used and CLEARLY marked on what's in the bottle. **DO NOT** use bleach mixture on clothing or any type of cloth materials.
- Use paper towels to wipe the surface and throw them away after each use. Rags are acceptable but must be laundered after use.

Frequently touched surfaces such as:

Door Handles

Sink Handles

Toilet Handles

Toilet Seats

Table Tops

Chairs

Benches

Showerheads

Shower Curtains

Shower Floors

Shower Walls

Railings

High Touched surfaces such as:

Program Supplies such as Hammers, Leather punches, stampers, BB guns, Rifles, Shotguns, Glasses, Earmuffs, Bows, Arrows, compasses, flashlights, knives, boats, oars, paddles, etc.
