

Guidelines for Camper Sickness at Camp Don Harrington and/or Camp MK Brown

(guidelines come from the CDC)

Overnight Camps and Council/District Day Camps

- The assigned staff member who collects Pre-Departure/Pre-Event Medical Clearance Forms, must wear a Face Mask and Gloves at all times. In addition, when taking individual temperatures, the staff member must wear a mask and gloves. These should be disposed of upon completion of this task. (As an additional precautionary measure the staff member must wash their hands with antibacterial soap immediately following the removal of the mask and gloves).
- Staff and campers with symptoms (fever, cough, or runny nose) at camp should immediately be separated. (This is upon arrival at the camp only) (These people should return home).
- If a camper/staff reports any COVID-19 symptoms, staff must immediately isolate this camper in the assigned room before any other treatment or first-aid is attempted. The staff member must wear a mask and gloves prior to entering the isolation room and no other camper will be allowed to enter with the exception of a parent/guardian.
- Work with camp administrators, Camp Ranger, nurses, and other healthcare providers to identify an isolation room or area to separate anyone who exhibits COVID-like symptoms.
- Staff and campers who have had close contact with a person who has symptoms should be separated.
- The Council Physician should be contacted with any of these incidents for further instructions. He can be contacted through the Asst. Scout Executive, Scott Kilian at 806-679-4238 before or after regular business hours. Call the Scout office at 806-358-6500 during business hours.

Isolate and Transport Those Who are Sick

- If a person becomes sick and needs to be transported, establish procedures for safely transporting them. If you are calling an ambulance or bringing someone to a healthcare facility, try to call first to alert them that the person may have COVID-19.

Clean and Disinfect

- Close off areas used by a sick person and do not use these areas until after cleaning and disinfecting them (for outdoor areas, this includes surfaces or shared objects in the area, if applicable).
- Wait at least 24 hours before cleaning and disinfecting. If 24 hours is not feasible, wait as long as possible.

Notify Health Officials and Close Contacts

- In accordance with state and local laws and regulations, camp administrators should notify to Scout Executive or Assistant Scout Executive at 806-358-6500 or 806-679-4238 and the parent/guardian immediately of any case of COVID-19 symptoms.
- Advise those who have had close contact with a person that's had symptoms of COVID-19 to separate themselves, self-monitor for symptoms, and follow CDC guidance if symptoms develop.
