Following graduation from Oklahoma State as the University's top graduate, Mr. Drummond flew the F-15C fighter jet in two operational Air Force squadrons between 1986 and 1992, serving as a combat mission commander in the Gulf War and earning the Distinguished Flying Cross and three Air Medals. He then attended Georgetown Law while serving U.S. Senator Boren as legislative assistant. Currently he owns or is majority owner of Blue Sky Bank, Drummond Communications, LLC (US Cellular's largest national agency), Post Oak Lodge and Retreat, an Osage County cattle ranch, and a twelve lawyer firm. He is also involved with abstracting and title services in Oklahoma, Texas and New Mexico through Oklahoma Abstract Partners and Oklahoma Title Partners, respectively.
