

United in Tradition - 76 Years of Unity, Strength, and Vision.

This year, we celebrate the deep-rooted legacy of Scouting in Texas. We honor the longstanding traditions that have united Scouts over generations, fostering resilience and growth within their communities. This year's Report to State will highlight how Scouts continue to embody these values, demonstrating their commitment to service and leadership.

The 76th Annual Report to State is scheduled for February 8, 2025, and we would be honored to have your council represented at this significant event. Due to space limitations, each council may send a delegation of up to 12 people, including youth, adults, and your youth delegate speaker.

The event begins at 7:30 AM on February 8 with a Delegate Breakfast and Program at the First United Methodist Church Family Life Center, located at 1300 Lavaca St., Austin, TX 78701. Breakfast will also be provided for Spectators in a separate area from the Delegate Breakfast. After breakfast, council delegates will accompany other scouts on a processional to the south steps of the Capitol for the Scout Spirit Rally, followed by the Report to State ceremonies in the Texas Capitol (room TBD). This year, we ask again that your council have your youth delegate speaker select a point of the Scout Law and focus their report on how your council has lived by that point over the past year. An overall state delegate speaker will be selected to present the statewide analytics.

We are also excited to announce a Patch Design Competition for this year's event. We invite Scouts to showcase their creativity by designing a patch that represents the spirit of this event. Designs must be turned in by **December 6**. The winning design will be produced as the official patch for the 2025 Report to State, and the designer will be recognized at the event. Additional details and submission guidelines will be shared soon.

Please have your delegation leader complete <u>online</u> registration, along with payment, by Monday, January 13, 2025. There will also be opportunities for spectators to attend the Report to State as well as an Eagle Scout Reunion (Open to Eagle Scouts across Texas). This year there will be separate registration links for <u>Delegates</u> and <u>Spectators</u>.

The tradition of sharing the successes of the Scouting movement with the citizens of Texas dates back to 1949. This unique opportunity allows Scouting to present a report of strength, growth, and service and demonstrate the effective implementation of Scouting values. For many Scouts, this will be their first time visiting the state capitol. The legend, lore, and history of the great State of Texas can make your delegate's trip educational, inspirational, and awe-inspiring – truly a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity!

Patch Design Guidelines

Report to State Patch Design Competition: Parameters and Guidelines

Theme:

- "United in Tradition – 76 Years of Unity, Strength, and Vision"

All designs should reflect this theme, focusing on the spirit of unity, Scouting values, and the celebration of tradition.

Eligibility:

Open to all registered Scouts in councils participating in the 76th Report to State.

Design Specifications:

1. Patch Shape:

The design must fit within a 4-inch by 4-inch square or circle.

2. Color Scheme:

Up to 8 colors can be used in the design and the official Scouting fleur de lis where possible.

3. Elements to Include:

- The year (2025) and the number 76 to mark the 76th annual Report to State.
- The event name: "Report to State".
- The theme text or symbols reflecting unity, strength, tradition, and vision.
- Optional: Incorporate Texas imagery (e.g., state capitol, lone star, state outline).

4. Submission Format:

- Entries must be submitted as a digital image (JPEG, PNG, or PDF).

- 5. Deadline for Submission:
- All designs must be submitted by December 6th.

6. Judging Criteria:

- Creativity and originality in representing the theme.
- Relevance to Scouting principles and the spirit of the Report to State.
- Clarity and effectiveness of the design within the given space and specifications.


7. Judging Process:

- Report to State Committee members will judge the submissions.
- 8. Prize:
- The winning design will be produced as the official patch for the 76th Report to State.
- The designer will receive free registration, recognition at the event, and a framed patch.
- 9. How to Submit:

 Please submit your design along with your name, council, and contact information to andra.allen@scouting.org by the deadline.

10. Ownership Rights:

- By submitting a design, participants agree that the design may be modified for production purposes.



What is it? The National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) 6-day program integrates the best of modern leadership theory with the traditional strengths of the scouting experience to train young men and women to better serve their units when placed in leadership positions. Youth registered with Scouting America, that are at least 13 years of age (as of the start of the course!), have earned the rank of First Class (Scouts BSA only), and have completed Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops or Crews, are eligible to participate. Youth who are registered Venturers and Sea Scouts do not need to achieve the First Class rank, but must attend Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews (ILSC) prior to participating in NYLT.

Here's a brief outline of what Scouts can expect to accomplish during this training:



Youth will learn Communication skills, how to run a patrol in their troop, team building sessions, conflict resolution, ethics and values in decision-making – all with fun activities attached so youth enjoy their week at NYLT!

Would you like a stronger and more confident Scout? Mark your calendar for *June 1-6, 2025* and get your eligible youth trained to go to NYLT! This is a week your Scouts will talk about for life!

2025 Camp MK Brown Summer Camp

Many troops from our council go to summer camp in the mountains or at the sea. Do you know we have our own summer camp near Wheeler, Texas? Yes, this beautiful camp property has a lake that is full of fish where Aquatics merit badges are also available. We have two shooting ranges, an archery range and our camp is so popular that out of council troops even come for the fun! Camp MK Brown has an awesome first year camper program called Polaris where newer scouts can earn two merit badges AND get requirements done for the first three ranks (Scout, Tenderfoot, Second Class). The after hours activities include branding, open aquatics, cobbler cook-off competition, and water balloon war. After a full day of activities, we feed you copious amounts of food. Just ask folks who attended in 2024 and see what they say!

We know we aren't the mountains but what we do have is great adult instruction, fun evening hour programs, and a fun staff that will get your scouts excited.


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
